

New MPMCP President's Appointed

Jim Bruner

On August 13, 2011, Jim Bruner of Bruner Plumbing and Heating Company took the reins of the Michigan Plumbing and Mechanical Contractors Association (MPMCA), our statewide association for plumbing and mechanical contractors. Jim supports and now leads MPMCA because he believes that they are a diverse group of individuals (both union and nonunion), who get along very well and have a common interest in advancing the plumbing industry in Michigan.

Jim Bruner is a true gentleman and as such, has earned a stellar reputation in the Detroit area plumbing industry as a man who is dedicated to excellence and relationship-building. It is fitting that his knowledge and gentle spirit will now become known statewide.

Jim decided to seek out a plumbing career one day, soon after he graduated from high school, while standing next to a plumber in line waiting for a paycheck at Wayne County General Hospital. He noticed a big difference in the paychecks! Then one day, Local 98 announced on the local radio that it was taking apprentice applications. When he arrived at the Local 98 training center the next day, there were one thousand people in line to get applications, five hundred of those took the test a year later and thirty-eight of them were accepted into the Apprenticeship Program. Jim was one of them. He was the only minority at the school at that time (initiated in March of 1973 and turned out in 1978). He knows that the number of minorities has increased since that time, but says more progress needs to be made. Jim also said of those times, "Back then you had to work a lot harder as there were no power tools or new material. I got in at the end of the lead and oakum period."

Jim's first job in plumbing, as an apprentice, was working for Donald Miller at the Ford Office Building in Dearborn. Then he went on to Innerlakes Mechanical and continued there when Midwest Mechanical took over, working at the Wayne County Sewage Plant. When he turned out, he was working for Irving Muskovich, one of the largest plumbing and mechanical contractors in southeastern Michigan, at Detroit Receiving Hospital.

In the early 80's construction work was scarce in Michigan, so Jim went to work at the Savannah River Power Plant in Augusta, Georgia. There he worked refurbishing one of the four nuclear reactors, donning a "spacesuit that pumped in air" each day to protect against radioactive exposure. He describes this work as a short, but very interesting time. Upon returning to Michigan he was approached by the Pipefitters at Local 636 and worked as a fitter at the Bell River Power Plant

for Babcock and Wilcox. He also did fitter work directly for the company at Renwalt Chemical Company.



In 1984, Joe Sposita of Plumbers Local 98 approached Jim to become a foreman at Wayne State University, where he worked in construction and remodeling. While there, Wayne State had labor problems and wanted to pay plumbers less money, so Jim decided to resign. But the Director so valued his skills and work ethic that he told Jim if he went to work for a contractor separate from the WSU personnel, they would pay him the union rate. After working for a while for a union contractor on the Wayne State Project, Jim decided to open Bruner Plumbing and Heating in October of 1990. His first client was Wayne State University! And he still works there today.

Wayne State also nominates Jim every year for the "Supplier of the Year" award from the Michigan Minority Business Association.

Today Jim Bruner has established himself as a premier plumbing contractor in the Detroit area for new construction, maintenance and remodeling. He joined the Board of Directors of MCA Detroit in 1995. His more recent clients have included: Detroit Institute of Arts, African American Museum, Detroit Historical Museum, the People Mover, Detroit's three casinos, the Farbman Group, Compuware, and the Renaissance Center. Notable among his projects is the completion of a joint venture that installed new transmitter water meters (so the meters no longer had to be read in person) throughout the city of Detroit.

Jim has been married to his lovely wife, Graziella ("G" for short) for ten years. Seeing them together, one can immediately know of the great love shared between them. Together they have five children: James, Jr. (a Local 98 Plumber and Jim's foreman for the past ten years), Angela, Ricky, Rickelle and Rickisha. Jim and Graziella enjoy traveling and have visited most of the Caribbean Islands, their favorite being Jamaica. Both went skydiving (ONCE only!) and Jim also has scuba dived though he questions where his next breath is coming from

GF Wilbur Plumbing & Heating, represented by George Wilbur and his son Jonathon Wilbur, Dan McGovern, retired former owner of McGovern Plumbing & Heating, along with Jonathon Judd, a Wilbur family friend formed team Bora-Bora to honor Jonathan Wilbur who has been fighting cancer for over nine years.

Team Bora Bora rode the 300 miles across Michigan in an effort to help other children experience the dream of having their wish come true. In 2002 at the age of 17, Jonathon was diagnosed with cancer. Jonathon began a series of intense weekly chemotherapy treatments that lasted 2-years.

As you can imagine this was the most difficult time of his life. Jonathon was an active all state swimmer and normal high school senior with his whole life in front of him, planning for college, plotting out his career, when all was crushed as his life took this wild turn. Shortly after his treatments began he was contacted by the Make-A-Wish foundation. Jonathon had been chosen as a Wish recipient.

This gift given to him is the reason the Team participated in the WAM 300, to be able to give the same opportunity to other children who have life threatening diseases and to be able to make their wishes come true. Here is Jonathon's story in his own words.

"You have cancer. Not one of the things someone wants to hear, especially a teenager. Those were the words I heard from the doctor on October 2, 2002. I was 17 and a state champion swimmer from Milan High School. I was planning on attending North Dakota University for aviation. All it took was one phone call to change my life completely. When I was a teenager I felt invincible, at some time or another I think every teenager feels that way. But I was wrong.

About a month before I was diagnosed, I was jumping on a trampoline when suddenly my left knee gave out. It was very painful but not enough to go to the hospital. After a couple of pain pills the pain subsided and I was able to walk again. The next day I woke up and was having problems walking right away, I immediately told my parents. One week later I had an appointment with an orthopedic surgeon, he suggested that I needed an MRI to assess the problem. The next week went by really slow; I had a lot to think about. Finally the time came to go to the bone cancer specialist. The doctor I went to see was right to the point, she did not have a good bedside manner but you do not have to when you are the best in the field. She suggested that I get a biopsy on the tumor to find out if it was cancerous or not.

Four days later I was sitting in a prep room waiting to get a large needle pushed into my femur. After the two hour procedure it was time to go home. I was not able to walk for the rest of that day. The next day I was feeling well enough to go to our schools basketball game, it wasn't enjoyable I had to use crutches, but on the brighter side of things I was able to park in a handicap space. When the game was through I went home, as I was pulling in my driveway I noticed a lot of cars around. I was thinking to myself why are there people at my house on a Tuesday night at nine; it never crossed my mind that my results were in about my tumor. As I pulled up my mother, father, and grandfather were sitting outside waiting for me, they asked me to park my truck and come inside, and I demanded to know why. As my father told me I had cancer, but not just any cancer, a cancer called pre-b cell lymphoblastic lymphoma and that I had to be at the hospital at six the next morning my mind just went blank, I wasn't sad, I wasn't mad, I was just there."

The Facility for Rare Isotope Beams (FRIB) will be a new national user facility for nuclear science, funded by the Department of Energy Office of Science (DOE-SC) Office of Nuclear Physics and operated by Michigan State University (MSU). FRIB will cost approximately \$600 million to establish and take about a decade for MSU to design and build. As a national user facility, FRIB will provide intense beams of rare isotopes (that is, short-lived nuclei not normally found on Earth). FRIB will enable scientists to make discoveries about the properties of these



rare isotopes in order to better understand the physics of nuclei, nuclear astrophysics, fundamental interactions, and applications for society.

FRIB will have a total of 5,783 one-year jobs and 791 direct construction employment jobs. Mr. Bull explained that the main reason for the presentation is to partner with the construction trades in the planning and building of this state-of-the-art scientific facility. The presentation was followed by a tour of the UA Local 333 Training Center located at LCC West Campus (pictured below).

MCA Detroit Report

2011 Plumber Negotiations and 2012 Pipefitter Negotiations

After data collection, MCA staff put their heads together and brainstormed new and creative options that would allow the contractor to bid more commercial work at a lower rate, thereby expanding this market.

Preparations for this year's negotiations began over a year and a half ago. Long hours were put into this effort by Carl Evans, Chris Freeman and John Nussbaum.

They gathered significant data from Michigan and from around the country with the goal of making MCA contractors more competitive.

After data collection, MCA staff put their heads together and brainstormed new and creative options that would allow the contractor to bid more commercial work at a lower rate, thereby expanding this market. Once the contractor negotiating committee became involved the plan became concrete.

From the beginning of negotiations, Local 98 members not only understood the contractor situations, they embraced the goal of expanding the low rate market. They did so by more clearly defining the Building Trades rate, opening up the light commercial/service category a much broader definition of work that could be done in that pay classification. Together Union and Management forged a ground breaking business model for MCA contractors. It is important that all plumbing contractors now understood this language and put into place new efforts that will increase plumber hours in the coming years.

Special thanks to the Management Negotiating Committee: Bill James of Bill James Plumbing, Jim Mollicone of Western Mechanical, Carl Pistolesi of Danboise Mechanical, Mark Jones of John E. Green Company, Mike Scott of Oakland Plumbing, Charlie Reynolds of C&R Plumbing and Bob Battista, MCA's labor attorney who spent many long hours in negotiations and who spoke as one on the behalf of all MCA Plumbers. The information about business concerns shared with the union was invaluable.

Equally important to thank is the negotiating team from Plumbers Local 98. Led by Business Manager, Carlo Castiglione, all Local 98 Business agents, the Executive Board and several members, this group displayed unprecedented cooperation. The strong voices of Carlo Castiglione, Mike McIlroy, Wade Kovak, Dan Nixon and Jon DeRoo represented the union members well.

This month, (September 2011) Contractor meetings have begun to prepare for the 2012 Pipefitter Negotiations, with the same goal in mind – to make the contractor more competitive in the current market. In particular, HVAC Service issues will be at the top of the negotiation agenda.

A group of sixteen contractors and service managers will meet once a month and the union leadership will probably join us in informal discussions in November 2011, with formal negotiations kicking off in February or March next year.

On a local level he has been involved as an active member of the Washtenaw County Specialty Contractors



However, licensed plumbers must provide their license number and date of the license expiration. License plumbers must have current license to receive the backflow certification. If the license is expired a letter of completion will be issued limiting testing to the premises of their current place of employment.

Other graduates who are not licensed plumbers receive a letter of completion, limiting testing to the premises of their current place of employment only. They are not permitted to test in the field, install, or make repairs to backflow devices.

Participants will receive 21 hours (2.1 continuing education credits) MDEQ Division of Water Supply.

Under Act 54 – Plumbing Inspectors registration Act – Plumbing Inspectors will receive 24 continuing education credits, 16 specialty hours and 8 technical hours.


